## Only in Casper is the Road to Yellowstone this Iconic

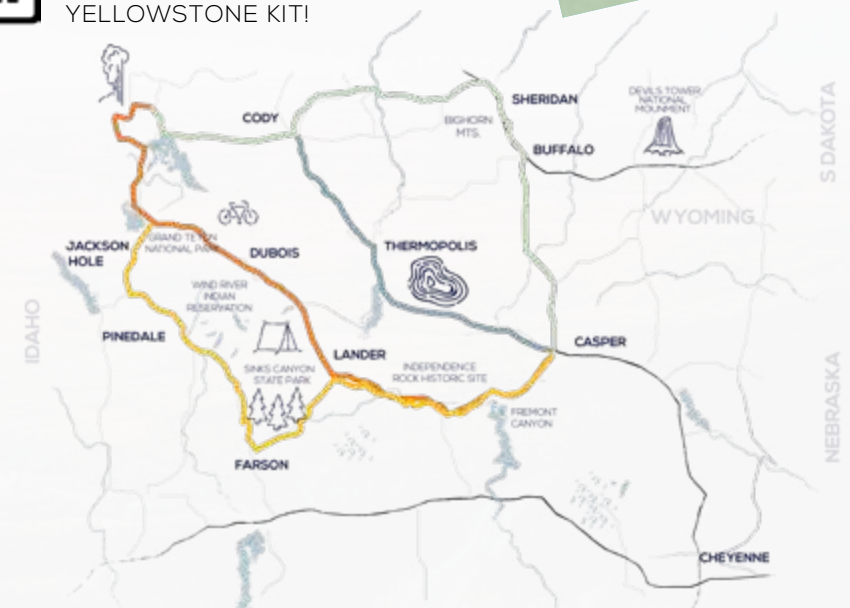

But the perfect Yellowstone vacation doesn't begin at one of the park's five entrances, it starts in the One & Only Casper.

In Casper, top-notch outdoor recreation opportunities are perfectly complemented by the convenience of nearby hotels, dining, and vibrant nightlife - offering an experience unlike anywhere else, even Yellowstone. Many of our most prized natural attractions are within five minutes of our downtown, leaving more time to create those Wyoming memories you'll always cherish. Accessible via Casper/Natrona County International Airport, Casper is the obvious hub for your trip. ### CHARMING TOWNS

This route leads you through Buffalo, Sheridan & Cody.  
**DISTANCE:** 358 MILES - **DRIVE TIME:** APPROXIMATELY 6 HRS 30 MIN.



### HOT SPRINGS & HISTORY

This route takes you through Thermopolis, where you'll find the Wyoming Dinosaur Center & Hot Springs State Park  
**DISTANCE:** 316 MILES - **DRIVE TIME:** APPROXIMATELY 5 HRS 30 MIN.



### OUTDOOR ENTHUSIASTS

While one of the more direct routes, there are still plenty of adventure options along the way near Lander & Dubois  
**DISTANCE:** 275 MILES - **DRIVE TIME:** APPROXIMATELY 4 HRS 45 MIN.



### SCENIC ROAD-TRIP

A stop inside Grand Teton National Park makes the added time along this route well worth it  
**DISTANCE:** 405 MILES - **DRIVE TIME:** APPROXIMATELY 7 HRS

If the Road to Yellowstone is on your horizon, allow me to suggest Casper as a pro's kick off. My name's Brady, I'm a motorcycle man native to Ol' Wyo and I know this land like the back of my hand. To start, a journey through Wyoming can be as deep or shallow as you choose. I've seen countless tourists take the fastest routes, get their selfie, tag the location on the 'gram and move on to the next. As if travel is some to-do list and the one with the most places visited wins. In my opinion, you can "visit" a place and never actually have "been there." Wyoming isn't just a state – it's a state of mind.

Before you set out on the Road to Yellowstone, spend some time in the heart of Wyoming: Casper. My advice? Kick off your day in downtown Casper at *Eggington's* - my favorite breakfast spot where I always order more than I can eat. After, take a stroll and pop into the local shops. They say "When in Rome do as the Romans do." I say, "When you roam, do as the roamers do," so make sure to stop in at the iconic *Lou Taubert Ranch Outfitters*. At Lous you can get proper Wyoming

attire, and they even fixed me up with a hat box that I could strap to my bike: BIG win!

Next, with coffee in hand from any of the local coffee shops (Metro, Scarlows, Perfect Cup, you can't go wrong), rip up Casper Mountain for some twisties, elevation and stunning views of the diverse land. You'll see the blend of rugged historic terrain and modern amenities that make up Casper, with local culture deeply rooted in its cowboy heritage and a culture invested in blending that history with modern-day amenities.

No matter how you travel, I encourage you to take your time. Breathe in the local sights and get a feel for the area while you're here - things change a bit once you get to the park! So, before you embark on the long stretches to Yellowstone, fill up on tasty eats, explore the culture, and chat with folks you meet along the way. You'll embark on your Yellowstone adventure with a deeper appreciation for the beauty and spirit that makes Wyoming, Wyoming from the locals at the heart of it.

### A RTIFACTS INTACT

Leave historical sites how you found them. If you discover a cool artifact, note its location and leave it there for the next visitor to enjoy!

### C LOSE TO CAMP

Remain in designated recreation areas, ie. trails, parking spaces, boat ramps, etc.

### E XTINGUISH FIRES

Fire MUST be fully extinguished before walking away from any site.

### S AFETY FIRST

Make sure you know the local emergency numbers closest to you before adventuring. You can find a list of these on pg. 71 of this guide.

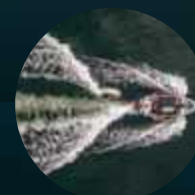

As one of the most popular recreational reservoirs in the region, Alcova is the perfect spot to dive into summer memories – whether you’re adventuring alone or with family and friends.

With six campgrounds, eight boat ramps, and nearby hiking trails waiting to be explored, you’ll also have plenty of time

to sit back, relax, and enjoy some of the most picturesque sunsets in the entire state.

Looking to amp up the fun? **Alcova Marina** has you covered for boat, jet ski, or kayak rentals. Imagine how magical your sunrise excursions will be gliding across the water as the sun peaks over the horizon.

Connected to the reservoir, you won’t want to miss out on an adventure to **Fremont Canyon**. With its towering red rock walls, you can paddle, boat, or kayak through the breathtaking

landscapes, taking in the unforgettable views and serene sounds of nature that surround you.

For visitors interested in history, just down the road you’ll find **Pathfinder Reservoir**. With 117 miles of shoreline, Pathfinder’s expansive waters are controlled by the Pathfinder Dam, an impressive feat of engineering that’s stood since the early 1900s. Soak in the incredible views of the area and set out on the 1.7 mile long interpretive trail nearby, and for more in-depth information

about the stunning historical area you can visit the **Pathfinder Interpretive Center** (by appointment).

So, whether you’re seeking refreshing water activities, a peaceful paddle through the stunning canyons, or a place to simply unwind and soak in nature’s beauty, Alcova Reservoir, Fremont Canyon, and Pathfinder Reservoir offer the perfect backdrops for unforgettable experiences. Pack your gear, stock up on your favorite snacks, and dive into the adventures waiting for you in this striking corner of Natrona County.

# “...THE BEST FISHING TOOL...”

When I arrived on the **North Platte River** banks in the sultry summer of 1999, I had just moved back to Wyoming after a year away. I didn’t unpack. Instead, I immediately bought an annual non-resident fishing license. At the fly shop, I asked the clerk to pick out a half-dozen flies for me. He urged me to buy a baggie of split shot, advised me to get my flies down, and sold me a pack of yarn indicators. With that, I headed out for **Grey Reef**, with my only companion - back then - my overweight chocolate lab, Sweets.

Together, we found the parking area at the dam and, as if we had been doing this for years, waded in among the other fly fishermen. Remarkably, I caught several fish on that first outing. Sweets crowded me, nipping at the thrashing fish – some of the largest trout I had ever encountered. The North Platte was living up to its reputation as one of the best tailwaters in the country, thanks in part to the heroic restoration efforts by the local **North Platte River Revival** group.

I didn’t return to Grey Reef for two weeks, but when I came back, the air had cooled a bit; things had changed, and the flies that had worked so well for me no longer were. I stuck with it for hours, venturing to the other access areas, but no luck. Watching a local angler hook fish at regular five-minute intervals, I stowed away my pride and asked him what he was using.

“Rock worm,” he said, showing me a

simple size 18 hook wrapped in red material. Even I could tie one of these... The man turned out to be one of the guides who had a rare day off. “Sometimes it’s the simplest things,” he added before hooking another rainbow.

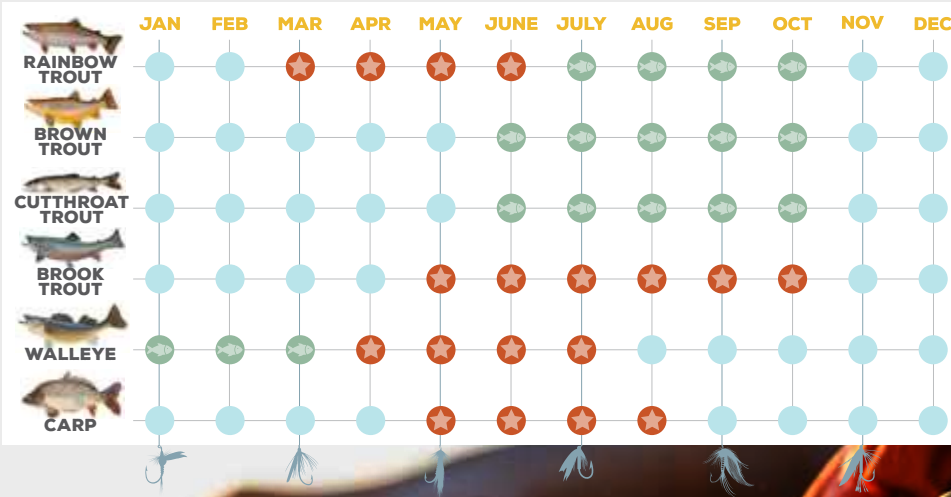
Sweets and I bumbled around Natrona County, getting lost on two-tracks without catching a single fish. My only success in those early days was when I fished with locals or dropped into fly shops to read the chalkboards. Because it’s a tailwater, there’s open water year-round. Decades of knowledge are passed down from seasoned guides to the young upstarts, all of which was available to me had I only taken the time to talk to the professionals behind the counters. But I was a slow learner, and didn’t do things the easy way back then.

The conclusion I came to that year was that the North Platte River system has no rival, and the best fishing tool is, without a doubt, the knowledge of the locals who came before me – who fished, tried, failed, and learned. When I try to compare the North Platte to other tailwaters, when I try to suggest a place with a chance at a trophy rainbow, I can’t think of anything that equals this one-of-a-kind stretch just outside Casper.

Though I came to these realizations and techniques over time, if I could go back to 1999 and find myself on the riverbanks, I would advise my younger-self to make friends with those guides and save myself a ton of trouble.

Born and raised near Omaha, NE, my parents took my brother and me west on fly fishing trips every summer. Who would’ve known that one day – after being drawn to the mountains to study Environmental Sciences at Utah State University – that I’d end up graduating and moving to Casper to manage the very shop that took us on our guided trips way back then!

One of the reasons I love living and working in Casper, at the **Ugly Bug Fly Shop** and **Crazy Rainbow Fly Fishing**, is how tight knit the community is here. We have so many enthusiastic anglers, and the relationships we build with returning guests are invaluable. Fly fishing is not just a sport; it’s an art passed down generationally amongst Casper natives and shared with anyone eager to learn more about the sport.

I’m so proud of the Ugly Bug and **Crazy Ladies** events that have been offered and flourishing over the past 5 years. We’re growing more each year with women traveling to attend from as far away as New York!

Fly fishing has historically been a male-dominated sport, but these events and courses help bridge the gap between interest and action, and I’m so proud to help remove the barrier of entry to the sport – creating avenues for women to become lifelong anglers.

I’m excited to continue to cultivate interest in and care for these new horizons, our traditions, and our fishery. We’ve worked to maintain a long season (almost 10 months), a healthy and diverse trout population, a river that allows for many methods of fly fishing, and a central location that’s easy to access while still feeling like the ‘Wild West’.

One of my passions is providing opportunities for others to experience fly fishing, after all, as I think there’s a lot to be found in Casper’s fly-fishing culture (and not only in the pursuit of fish). Whether you are looking for a new hobby, to immerse yourself in nature, find new community, or embrace a new challenge, you can find that here, and we’re so proud to be a staple in Casper fly fishing.

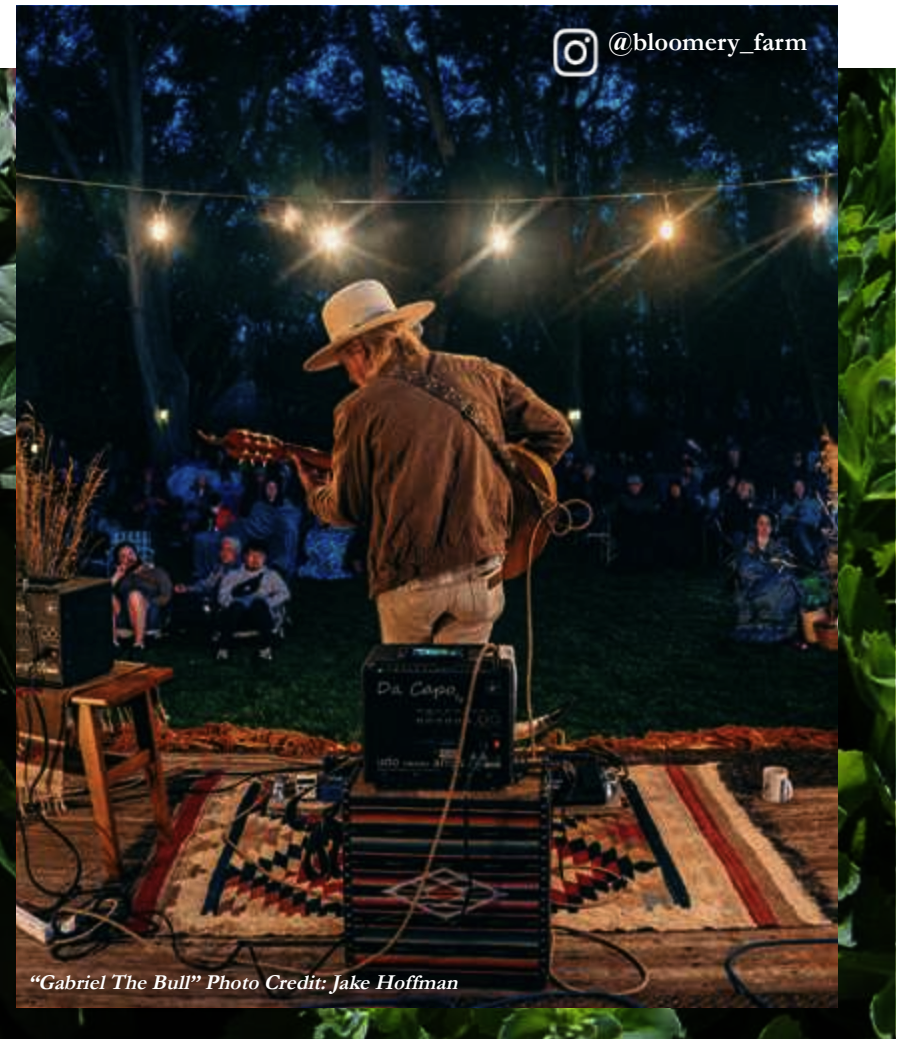

## CATHRYN BECKER- Owner & Creator of The Bloomery

I always dreamt the farm would be a place for people to 'step off the world for a while.' A land and haven for both people and wildlife. In 2020, I finally began to plan that dream and, with a flower garden planted and the first summer concerts booked, the farm 'bloomed' as it was always meant to.

This land, with over a century's worth of owners contributing to its uniqueness, reflects the agri-

based businesses and cultures of Casper and Wyoming. From the old bunkhouse to the native prairie (home to all kinds of wildlife), where we stand is rich with history that inspires us to be good stewards of it and our world.

While I don't know what the future holds, The Bloomery grew from 39 attendees at our first show to over 300 last summer. There's magic in every event and word of "Summer Concerts on the Farm" is

spreading among artists and bands from all over the country! With the mission of The Bloomery at the forefront (to host an accessible, welcoming, and memorable space for every visitor), the realization that the farm means so much to so many people inspires me to look to a future full of opportunities. From summer shows to creative and educational workshops and, of course, flowers!



## PATH TO THE PAST

At the heart of Wyoming lies some of the state's richest history, just waiting to be uncovered. Casper's storied past reaches as far back as the prehistoric era, through to the American Indian trails, fur trappers, and pioneers, and into the Wild West, a thriving oil and gas industry, and WWII. Casper offers a hands-on journey through time and history, and the best way to experience our touchable history is to just dive in.

### PREHISTORIC WYOMING

The area's amazing history stretches back thousands, even millions, of years. Connect with ancient history and start your journey through time by visiting the **Tate Geological Museum** at Casper College – where you can discover rich geological and prehistoric exhibits all for free! You can even watch as paleontologists work on their latest findings, and meet Dee, an 11,600-year-old Columbian Mammoth, along with thousands of his fossilized companions. At Alcova Reservoir, you can hike the **Cottonwood Creek Dinosaur Trails** and encounter fossils of some of the earliest dinosaurs in their natural setting.

### WHERE HISTORIC TRAILS MEET

As pioneers and forty-niners headed west in the mid-1800s, Casper became a central hub for some of the nation's most historical and well-traveled trails. With the **Oregon, California,**

**Pony Express,** and **Mormon Trails** all converging here, more than half a million travelers stopped in Casper to rest and refuel before continuing on their journeys. The stories they left etched into the landscapes extend beyond the trails themselves, though, as pioneers would carve their names into **Independence Rock** - a fascinating historical landmark - before resuming their final treks west. A remarkable site, the rock sits just 50 miles southwest of Casper off Highway 220, where you can still see the names of those inspiring adventurers.

Visitors can learn more about the trails at the world-class **National Historical Trails Interpretive Center**, **Fort Caspar Museum** and the **Mormon Handcart Visitors Center** at **Martin's Cove**; where each visit offers the chance to connect with the past and create lasting memories.

### THE OIL CITY

As early pioneers began to see the beauty of Casper, a settlement was built. What started as a cluster of shacks transformed into a small town of 1,000 residents in the 1800s. Following the oil boom of the early 1900s, Casper's population skyrocketed – growing by over 600% - earning our small western town the title of the “Oil capital of the Rockies”.

### MILITARY & AVIATION

During World War II, Casper briefly served as an Army Air Base contributing their support to the war effort. Today, remnants of that era can be explored at **The Hangar** (just 10-minutes from Casper), or the Casper/Natrona County International Airport, where several original buildings and hangars still stand, including the **Wyoming Veterans Memorial Museum**.

Scan the QR Code for a self-guided tour, where you'll dive into fascinating stories about the airport's wartime operations and how soldiers had their own bowling alley right on base! These museums and tours offer a chance to connect with a little-known, but important history, while honoring the sacrifice made.

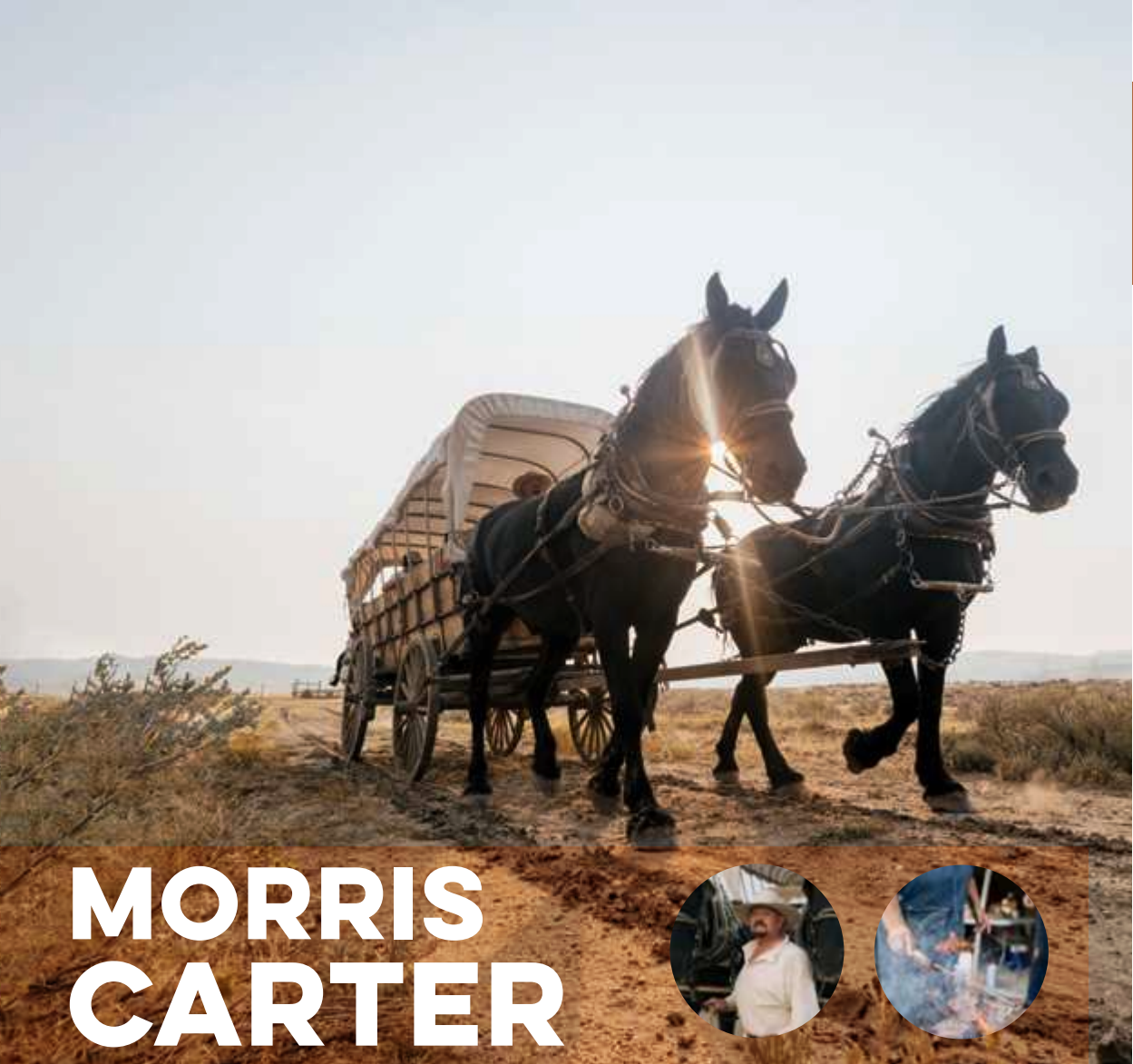

## OUTDOOR RECREATION

### **Rock Climbing**

When it comes to rock climbing, Casper may not be at the top of your list, but it should be! Situated 30-minutes from Casper is **Fremont Canyon** - one of the most beautiful, hidden destinations in Wyoming. With towering rock walls and the North Platte River flowing through it, the canyon is just as visually beautiful as it is challenging. With steep canyon walls, climbs range from 40 to 400+ feet and range in difficulty from 5.6 to 5.13, allowing for climbers of all skill levels to experience and enjoy this best-kept Casper secret.

### **Biking**

It's never too early to tune your mountain bike up for the season! Casper has an exciting up-and-coming mountain biking scene on Casper Mountain: home to beautifully lush trails of varying difficulty and length. For riders looking for paved trails, look no further than the miles of concrete paths that stretch and wind along the **Platte River Trails**. No matter your

skill level, Casper is home to bike trails and paths guaranteed to offer a memorable and scenic spring ride.

### **Wildlife Watching**

Wildlife is abundant in-and-around Casper, but especially in spring when the deer roam with their fawns, birds begin their warm-weather songs, and small mammals emerge from their winter-shelters. While **Edness Kimball Wilkins State Park** boasts beautiful trails and premium fishing locations, the park is also well-known for being a must-experience wildlife-watching destination and designated important bird area by the Wyoming Audubon Society.

Just a 10-minute drive from Casper and with over 360-acres nestled on the North Platte River, the area features endless cottonwood trees and riparian areas making it a natural habitat for a variety of wildlife including birds, deer, antelope, and fox: a wildlife and bird watchers' paradise.

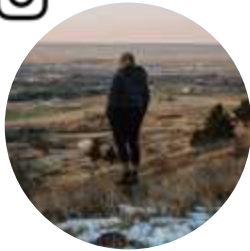

At **Three Crowns** - a former oil refinery once known for pumping out 100,000 barrels of oil during its prime in 1923 - the front and back nine are as challenging as they are scenic, with clear views of Casper Mountain. If players are feeling hungry, they can also stop in at Three Crowns' restaurant, **The Refinery**, for refreshments and food!

Casper Municipal Golf Course, also featuring stunning views of the mountain, is a more affordable and beginner-friendly course. The course has three different nine-hole courses, and offers twilight golf where players can take advantage of discounted prices after 5pm!

### *Summer Hiking*

Sitting five-minutes south of town, Casper Mountain teems in the summer months with wildlife and outdoor enthusiasts. With over 50-miles of multi-use trails to ride, hike, or run, time between the iconic mountain sunrises and sunsets is easily lost.

Here, you can hit the trails for hiking or mountain biking and set up camp at any of the designated camping areas to enjoy the peace of nature.

Local favorite hikes include the Bridle Trail at Rotary Park - a 4.5-mile loop that wraps around the Garden Creek Falls waterfall and showcases stunning vistas of Casper, or the 4.1-mile Eadsville Trail - starting at the Casper Mountain Trails Center and immersing visitors in the mountain's lush forest filled with colorful Aspen trees.
